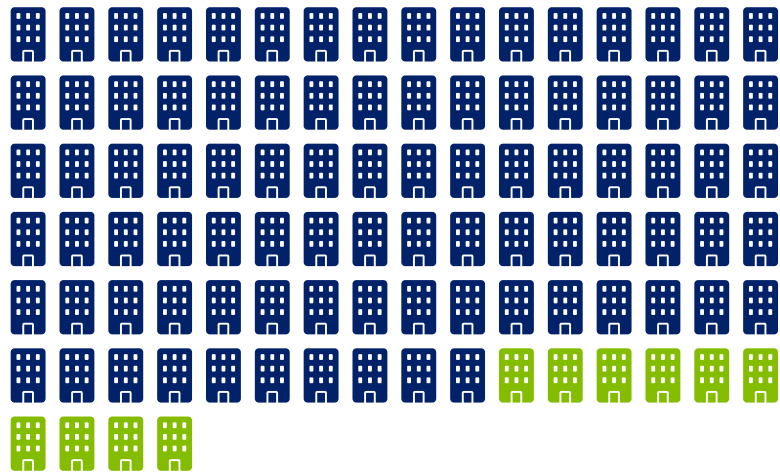
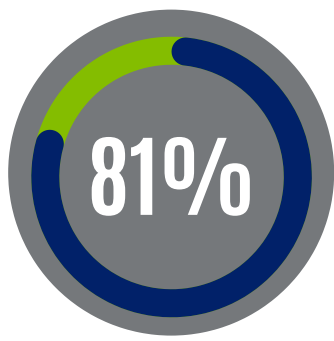

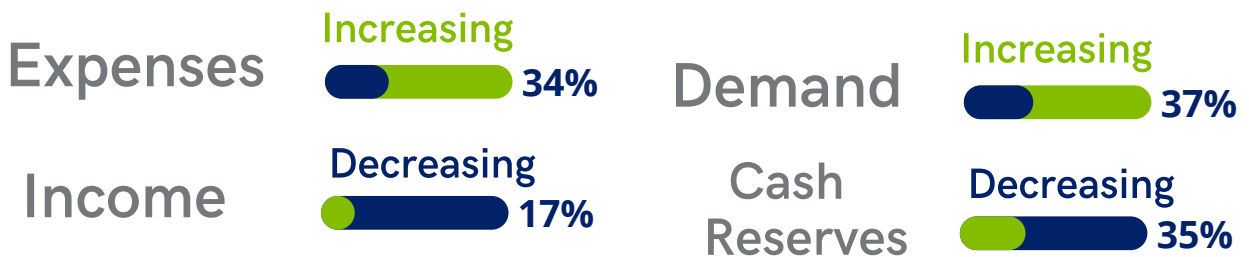
FOURTH QUARTER 2021

Eighty one percent of community nonprofits reported being optimistic about the next 12 months, **this is a decrease from 90% in the third quarter.**

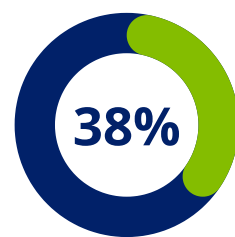
FINANCIAL EXPECTATIONS NEXT 3 MONTHS?



A expected bias toward decreasing income **is a shift from an increase in the third quarter.** It is paired with expected increased demand and decreased cash reserves.

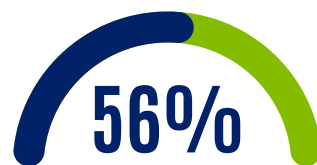

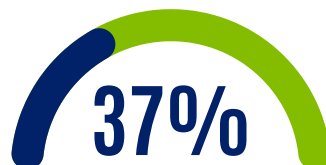

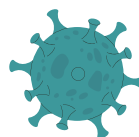
