### Census of Population

Provides a comprehensive collection of demographic, social, and economic conditions of the population of Canada

Conducted every five years

Key source for small geographical area data

Source of data for specific target populations such as lone-parent families, Indigenous peoples, immigrants, seniors and language groups

#### Census Process and Procedures

Information collected by Statistics Canada is kept strictly confidential

By law, response to the census is mandatory

Statistics Canada employees are sworn to secrecy under the Statistics Act Respondents name, address and telephone number are not entered in Statistics Canada's production database





### Census Method

#### De jure census method

"Usual place of residence" as a means of ensuring that residents are counted once and only once. Counts the population at their usual or most common place of residence

#### **De facto** method

• Counts the population at the address they are found on census day

# Data were **collected directly**, except:

- Income data
- Selected immigration variables



# Despite pandemic, Canada's population grows at fastest rate in G7: census | CBC News



""Despite the pandemic, Canada remains the fastest-growing country in the G7, thanks in large part to immigration, according to 2021 census data released Wednesday.

The newly released census numbers put Canada's population at 36,991,981 in the spring of last year, with close to 27.3 million Canadians living in one of Canada's 41 large urban centres.

There are approximately 1.8 million more people living in Canada than there were five years ago, a growth rate of 5.2 per cent between 2016 and 2021....."

".... Resort areas such as Squamish, B.C., Canmore, Alta. and the Ontario towns of Wasaga Beach and Collingwood were among the fastest growing towns in Canada...."

#### Census in the media

"...The North's population continues to skew younger than the country as a whole with millennials now outnumbering baby boomers in all three territories, and Generation Z dominating in Nunavut, according to new census figures released on Wednesday.

"What we're generally seeing is a continuation of trends that have been going on for a while...[The territories] have some of the youngest populations in Canada."

According to 2016 census data, boomers then still made up the largest generational group in Yukon. By 2021, millennials had edged them out to become the larger group. It means that all three territories are now out of sync with Canada as a whole when it comes to demographics. Nationally, boomers — people now aged 56 to 75 — continue to be the largest generational cohort even as their numbers decline due to mortality...."





# Age distribution (%)




In 2021, about 8% of the population in Alberta were aged 35 to 39 years







# Distribution (%) of the population by broad age groups Census Metropolitan Area (CMA), Edmonton & Calgary 2021 Census










# Proportion of couple families & single parent families Census Metropolitan Area (CMA), Edmonton & Calgary 2021 Census








In Edmonton and Calgary, there were a higher proportion of married couple families with children than common-law couple families in 2021



# Family composition of couple families Census Metropolitan Area (CMA), Edmonton & Calgary 2021 Census












# Single parent family characteristics Census Metropolitan Area (CMA), Edmonton & Calgary 2021 Census


