The least advantaged Albertan youth were far more likely to be involved in the corrections system than the most advantaged Albertan youth

- 2,281 least advantaged Albertan youth 12 to 17 years old were identified, and compared to 201,840 remaining youth of the same age. Advantage was defined in terms of educational achievement, mental health, and socio-economic status.
- Among the least advantaged youth, 11.4% (260 youth) had some form of corrections involvement compared to 1.6% among the remaining Albertan youth (excluding the most advantaged youth).
