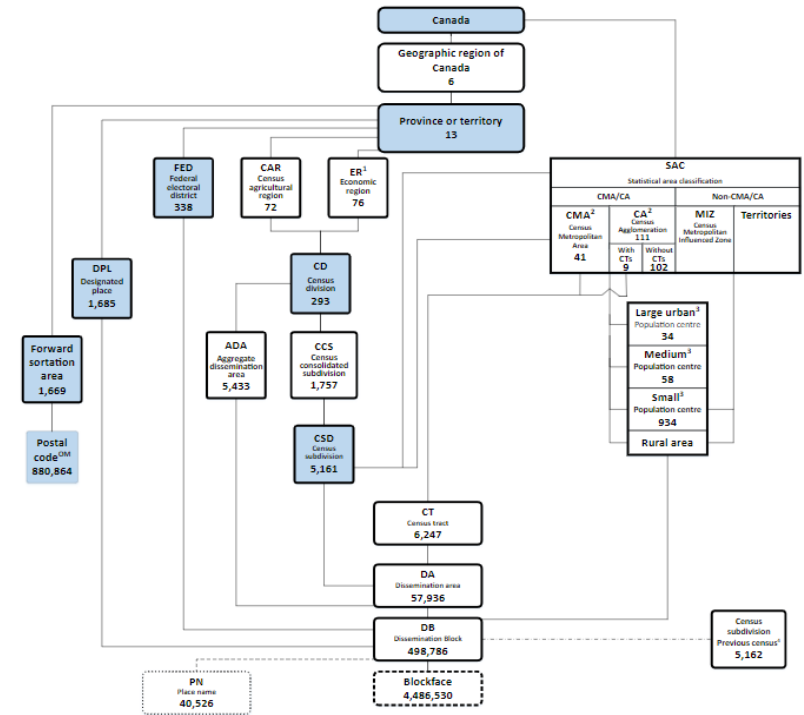


# HOW CAN I FIND THE GEOGRAPHY THAT I NEED?

## Use the hierarchy chart

- When looking at large administrative areas
- To know what other levels are part of the area
- If the area of interest has a name

# HOW CAN I FIND THE GEOGRAPHY THAT I NEED?

## Search using maps

- Statistics Canada has a Standard Geographical Classification (SGC) that categorizes all of the geographic areas in Canada
- SGC reference maps are available on the StatCan website for users to review to identify the geography they are interested in:

Search using geography name, postal code<sup>OM</sup>, or geographic code

- Using the StatCan website(census profiles), data users can search for different geographies by entering a:
  - Place Name
  - Postal Code<sup>OM</sup>
  - Geographic Code
