
#### **DATA VISUALIZATION**



#### Increasing diversity of languages, other than English or French, spoken at home

#### Language spoken predominantly at home<sup>1</sup>

While the number of Canadians who speak English or French predominantly at home has never been higher, their relative weight in the population has been declining since at least 2001 because of the more rapid increase of other languages.





4.6 million Canadians (12.7%) speak a language other than English or French predominantly at home

- Up from 2001 (9.7%).
- Strong growth in the number of Canadians who spoke a language from South Asia, as well as Mandarin, Arabic and Tagalog, predominantly at home.

Ranking of languages spoken predominantly at home by the largest number of people<sup>2</sup>








Predominant home language spoken by the largest number of people for some metropolitan areas<sup>2</sup>












#### **2021 CENSUS PROFILE**

#### **DATA TABLES**

This series of cross-tabulations presents a portrait of Canada based on the various census topics. They range in complexity and are available for various levels of geography.

Topics will become available according to the <u>release schedule of topics</u>. Data tables are also available and can be <u>browsed by variable</u> or browsed through a <u>map</u>.

#### RESEARCH

What is the nature and scope of the research you plan to do?

- Simple univariate analysis?
- Cross tabulations with multiple variables?
- What level of geography?
- What are the confidentiality rules / thresholds?

Research objectives dictate which data products you use



#### **UNIVERSES**

- Variables should all be related to the same universe
- Sub-universes
- User-defined universes



#### **V**ARIABLES

- Use reference material on StatCan website (e.g. dictionary, reference guides, concept overviews, etc., this link is especially useful: Browse data tables by variable, 2021 Census (statcan.gc.ca)
- Always check to see if something can be done
- User-defined variables



#### Beyond 20/20 Table View




Data in the Beyond 20/20 table are determined by:

- Dimensions that are "active" in the Table View
- Dimensions that are "parked" in the Table View

The active item of a dimension can be changed by:


- Selecting the dimension by highlighting it
- Using the arrow buttons to cycle/select the items, or draggingand-dropping the variable into the table
